Course: EXPH 3600: Understanding & Promoting Equity via the Social Determinants of Health

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will provide an overview of the current status of the Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) in the context of a large, urban city (Milwaukee context). Through the lens of cultural humility, students will engage with reading and questions for weekly discussion, as well as a weekly, synchronous online meeting (OR LIVE MEETING pending COVID) with community leaders in a number of interdisciplinary content areas including: Built Environment, Education access and inequity, Employment access and opportunity, Food Insecurity, Healthcare access and navigation, Housing access, and Community Building. Students will ideally get the chance to spend learning time in a FQHC, Food Pantry, Community Center, and Healthcare Navigation Agency under the guidance of community experts in each content area.

TEACHING METHODS AND LEARNING EXPERIENCES:

- A. Class lectures by instructor and guest lecturers (ONLINE Synchronous OR LIVE)
- B. Supplemental readings and handouts
- C. Online D2l Assignments
- D. Discussion amongst group online (weekly)

COURSE OBJECTIVES AND COMPETENCIES:

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- A. Identify components of cultural humility and application to practice in the health setting
- B. Identify the Social Determinants of Health, their impacts on wellness, and the effects of systemic oppression on the health of marginalized populations
- C. Develop an understanding of the community engagement process and the role of an ally/opportunities for partnership in the healthcare space
- D. Develop strategies to reduce barriers to and access to health SDOH factors for marginalized populations
- E. <u>Students will spend 45 hours on site</u> at either UniteWI (healthcare navigation) or Friedens Community Pantries/StreetLife Communities (Food/Housing Insecurity) experiencing SDOH from the community perspective
- F. Students will work in partnership with community partners (Friedens/StreetLife and UniteMKE) to create a project/work product that supports the organization and community, and will present that project at the end of the course
