- □ Give yourself time to explore your options
- A lease is a legally binding document

University Apartments

University Apartments

The Marq, Campus Town East and West, McCabe, Gilman, Frenn

- The assignment process begins in October of the preceding year for which housing is desired
- Students deposit \$300 to participate in the selection process
- Randomly assigned sign-up times
- Deposits will not be accepted after the deadline

Assignment Process Information

First Step: Deposit collection (\$300), Oct 18-29

Second Step: Returning resident assignment, Oct 25-

Nov 3

Third Step: New resident selection (evening), Nov 8

It's cheaper to share a bedroom

Campus Town 2bed/2bath

- □ \$1620/month*
 - 2 people: \$810/month
 - 3 people: \$540/month
 - 4 people: \$405/month

Campus Town 3bed/2bath

- □ \$2080/month*
 - 3 people: \$693/month
 - 4 people: \$520/month
 - 5 people: \$416/month
 - □ 6 people: \$347/month

CTE & CTW: fully furnished, cable & internet, microwave, dishwasher, all utilities except electricity

McCabe: partially furnished (beds, desks & dressers), all utilities included

Finding an apartment off-campus

Marquette Police: Services

- Patrol the off-campus neighborhood
- Respond to all calls from students living in the neighborhood
- Over 450 blue light phones located on- and offcampus
- □ Free home security surveys
- Vacant house watch
- LIMO service within patrol area

MUPD Patrol Area

It is a good idea to ensure that any property you rent is within the MUPD patrol area.

- East boundary: James Lovell St
- West boundary: 24th Street
- North boundary: Highland Avenue
- South boundary: Clybourn Street

- Monthly and one-time costs
- Security
- Amenities
- Subleasing policies
- The Landlord

What you pay varies depending on:

- Location
- Number of roommates
- Efficiency of unit
- Parking & amenities

Deposits

Landlords may require a variety of different deposits upon application or lease signing

- Earnest money (application fee)
- □ First month's rent
- □ Last month's rent
- Refundable security deposit usually equal to one month's rent

Renter's Insurance

You may never need renter's insurance, but if you do it will be well worth the cost!

- Landlords are not responsible for property damage or loss in the event of fire, theft, flood, etc.
- Tenant is responsible for providing insurance for their personal property
- Students may be covered under parent or guardian's insurance
- Available through most insurance companies at a relatively low cost

Before you sign a lease...

SHOPAROUND SHOPAROUND

- Explore all of your options
- View the ACTUAL apartment
- Talk to current residents
- Ask questions
- Get promises in writing
- Read & understand the lease BEFORE you sign
- Don't be pressured!

AFTER YOU SIGN A LEASE

OBTAIN AND KEEP FOR YOUR RECORDS A COPY OF YOUR SIGNED LEASE

Breaking a lease

Reasons you cannot break a lease:

- Roommate conflicts
- Transferring schools
- Withdrawing from school
- Studying abroad/co-op
- Don't like the apartment anymore
- Found a better/cheaper place
- Minor repair problems
- Utility bills are too high

Breaking a lease

Two ways to get out of a lease:

- Find a sublettor to take your place
 - Consult with landlord on sublease procedures
- Roommate(s) may agree to assume your share of the cost

This is also true in University Apartments

Student responsibilities

- Abide by the terms of your lease
- Alcohol be responsible hosts and guests
 - Invite only people you know
 - Keep your gatherings small
 - Don't serve underage drinkers
 - Avoid hosting if you are underage
 - Don't charge for parties
 - Call MUPD at the first sign of trouble

Accountability for actions

Students can be held accountable three ways for inappropriate behavior in the off-campus neighborhood:

- University conduct system
- Lease action (loss of security deposit and/or eviction)
- Municipal action

That said, students should NEVER hesitate to contact MUPD if there is a concern for safety. Any of the above consequences are a small matter relative to your own or another person's well-being!
